GEN-I lowering electricity and gas prices

With winter fast approaching and as part of its commitment to its customers, GEN-I has announced a reduction in its electricity and gas prices. The changes to the regular price lists, which come into force on 1 December, will lead to a reduction in gas prices for households and small businesses and in electricity prices for small businesses. Electricity prices for households will remain regulated by the government until the end of February.

Ljubljana, 19 November 2024 – Despite uncertainties on wholesale markets, GEN-I, with the support of its excellent international trading infrastructure, is reducing electricity and gas prices for its customers in the upcoming winter period. Gas prices for households and small businesses will fall by 15% from the beginning of December, while small businesses will see an 11% fall in the amount they pay for electricity, averaged across the tariffs.

The change to the regular price lists will take effect on 1 December, as detailed below.

Consumer care is one of the GEN-I Group's key guiding principles in the electricity supply segment, ably supported by active energy procurement management within an extensive international trading system. The Group are also developing products and services for efficient energy use that reduce customers' dependence on market energy prices and, at the same time, encourage customers and partners to continue their sustainable development and green transition efforts.



At the end of October, GEN-I and its subsidiary GEN-I Sonce unveiled the [Smart Self-Supply package](#), which offers households the highest possible level of energy independence. If they opt for the construction of a solar power plant with energy storage system, their monthly electricity bill can fall by as much as 60%. GEN-I received hundreds of enquiries regarding the package in the first three weeks, which shows the high level of interest among energy consumers.

Self-supply communities have come increasingly to the fore recently. These connect producers of electricity from renewable sources with their users. The communities provide their members, who can include household and business consumers, with stable, long-term savings in electricity costs, greater independence from price fluctuations on energy markets and reductions in their carbon footprint. These communities can be established for existing solar power plants or following the construction of new plants.
